Conducts legally sound, forensic interviews and sexual assault exams for all arms of law enforcement and Child Protective Services (DFCS) as well as follow-up, trauma-focused victim support services for victims and/or non-offending caregivers. Provides administrative duties as well as oversight of the county-wide Child Abuse Protocol and Child Fatality Review for the Office of the District Attorney's Office.

Provides temporary and emergency food assistance. Also provides personal care items when available. Established April 1983. Administered by LaGrange Personal Aid.


